

#### Found in the Archives

Recognizing our Heritage Volunteers' Service

Heritage Archiving is a relatively new activity when compared to the cultural activities that have been going on for decades at the JCCC. The Archives volunteers began working in 2010, meeting every Tuesday and Wednesday to work on cataloguing photographs and artifacts, identifying people in the pictures, and organizing our collections. Each month, we have tried to highlight artifacts or photographs found within our collection. This month, we are highlighting three of our hardworking volunteers.

At the Ontario Volunteer Service Awards in the early summer, three of our Archive Volunteers, Manabu Doi, Keo Shibatani and Harold Miwa were recognized for the service they have provided in the Archives since its 2011. All three have been staunch supporters of the Archives, helping to man the Archives table at different functions, cataloguing photos, and working as docents in the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre where they provide information about our JC history to students and visitors. Manabu has been instrumental in identifying people and places near Lemon Creek, BC. Harold and Keo helped to create the Tashme Historical Questionnaire that has helped us collect data on the residents who were interned in Tashme during World War II and they worked on the production of the Tashme Map, as well as the soon to be produced Tashme Brochure.

Heritage Archiving is truly enriched by the contributions of its volunteers who bring a wealth of knowledge to the task. We look forward to continuing to honour our volunteers at upcoming Ontario Volunteer Service Award ceremonies.

# Arts Committee Chair Bryce Kanbara Recognized with NAJC Award

On September 23, 2017, JCCC Arts Committee Chair and Hamilton based Japanese Canadian artist Bryce Kanbara accepted the National Association of Japanese Canadians (NAJC) Art Miki National Leadership Award – the highest honour of the NAJC – at the 2017 Conference and Gala held at the Canadian Museum of History. Here below is his acceptance speech, in its entirety. Congratulations on a well deserved honour, Bryce!



In 1984, I drove out of Hamilton in an old Ford Maverick and headed across Canada on my first pilgrimage trip to the Slocan Valley and the West Coast. On the way, I found the site of Angler Prisoner of War camp, near Marathon, Ontario, on the north shore of Lake Superior – where my father and uncles spent most of the war years. I stopped in Winnipeg to attend an NAJC conference much like this one. It was at a hotel on the outskirts of the downtown, and for a couple of nights I slept for free in the NAJC hospitality room in my sleeping bag.

I entered BC through Rogers Pass to Revelstoke, then Nakusp. My heart quickened as I headed south into Slocan Valley to New Denver where my mother's family, the Shimodas, spent the final term of their internment. To Slocan City where my mother worked in Clough's grocery store, and to Bay Farm where her family had lived during the first years of internment.

All along the westward way I had no compunction about seeking out local Japanese Canadians – Nisei mostly – in places with names that dot JC historical memory, like Greenwood, Kaslo, Rosebery, Lemon Creek, Sandon....There was something essentially familiar about the JCs I met – the way they spoke, the way they furnished and decorated their homes, their matter-of-factness, their hospitality. They reminded me of my uncles and aunts back home.

In Vancouver, I found my way to Powell Street and walked into Tonari Gumi just in time for lunch with the seniors. I met Take Yamashiro and Ken Shikaze, an ijusha and a sansei, and two of the most inspirational community workers and remarkable JCs I've ever met. That summer I was plunged into the rich, insular world of the Vancouver JC community. For me, and as Roy Miki has described, the West Coast has mythological status – it's the heartland of the JC experience after all, and the source of all the stories I've learned from my grandparents, parents, uncles and aunts. It's the place of their broken dreams. And from afar, in Hamilton, Ontario, it still has a burnished, nostalgic gleam.

COMMUNITY. I don't live exclusively in the JC community. I guess no one does anymore. But the JC community has provided a context for much of who I am and what I do. Recently I watched a TVO program about radical Islamists. One panelist insisted, and the others seemed to agree, that it wasn't ideology that drew young people to join groups or causes. He listed three primary reasons for the powerful attraction: Identity, Community, and Purpose. Identity, Community, and Purpose. As community

workers and developers, we ought to think about that and what we offer young people.

As I think back on my experiences in the JC community, I fondly remember all the people I'm indebted to. I specifically thank Hamilton NAJC – all the Nisei and Sansei board members and volunteers in my home community who time after time gave my ideas a chance to succeed or fail; all those people in Hamilton who showed up to meetings and events out of interest or duty, and didn't just stay at home.

And lastly, I want to mention two regrets: first, I regret never having had the opportunity to play hockey with Art Miki. And second, I had imagined how neat it would be if the award was a small statuette of Art that I could put on the mantel. I mentioned this to Pauline Kajiura and she said, "Wow, that would be fantastic! Even better – a bobble-head!"

I'm very grateful for this honour. Domo Arigato-gozaimasu. Thank-you.

#### **Break the Loop to Get Brainy**

水素水との4年間(最終話)

2017年新春号から連載してきた水素水体験記は、今月号で最後になります。

水素に関して最近もっとも注目されているのは、排気ガスを出さないクリーンな水素自動車です。また、水素には副作用がないので、水素分子を使った水素治療(点滴、注射、内服、外用など)も行なわれるようになりました。

正常細胞の突然変異でがん細胞が生じることも明らかにされつつあります。がん発生の機序は、遺伝子や環境など種々の要因が重なっており単純ではありませんが、ストレスの多い暮らしや食生活などで活性酸素が増えていることが大きなきっかけであるのは間違いないでしょう。細胞をいかに健やかに保つか(活性酸素を抑えるか)、それが命題です。

炎症が起こっている部位には沢山の活性酸素が発生。水素は活性酸素と直ぐに反応する性質ゆえに、それを目がけて突進します。「身体に必要な活性酸素には手を出さず、悪玉活性酸素だけを取り除く」。何とすごいことでしょう! 現時点でこれができるのは水素のみ。どのような薬物にもできないことです。

10年ほど様々な健康課題を経験しました。移住による適応障害(寒冷&乾燥による皮膚炎やドライアイ)、介護疲れによる胃腸障害(胃食道逆流症)、エイジングに伴う皮膚角質変化など。医師の指示通りに服用し、定期検査を受け、皮膚や目の適切なケアを行うなど、多様な努力を試みたものの一進一退の状態が続きました。ついには胃の痛みで食べれなくなり体重減少。さらには、寒冷刺激を避けるため冬は外へ出ない生活となり、クオリティ・オブ・ライフの低下を招きました!

ところが、水素水を飲み始めて徐々に(逆流症は劇的に!)解決され、それ以降4年間は全く内服薬や点眼薬を使用していません。保湿剤も必要でなくなりました。細胞を元気にし、炎症を除去するために日々働いてくれる水素水との出逢いに心から感謝するばかりです。

ところで、最高年齢でヒマラヤ登山に成功した三浦雄一郎さんが体力づくり&登山に活用したことをご存知ですか?同製品を使っている 私は、新しい挑戦へ勇気をもらっています。

水素水生成器には様々なものがあり、自宅で生成された活性水素がどのくらいの時間あるいは日数、その水の中にとどまっているかは製品によって異なります。とどまっていなければ、登山に携帯する、ご飯を炊く、スープを作る等には適しません。
