

#### An evening with Kodo's Chieko Kojima & Nagata Shachu

Chieko Kojima, founding member and principal dancer of Kodo, joins Nagata Shachu taiko group in an evening of dance, drums and song.

The JCCC and Nagata Shachu are proud to present Japanese dance and taiko artist Chieko Kojima. A founding member of the world renowned Kodo drummers of Sado Island, Kojima also has an active solo career that is perhaps best characterized by her ongoing project, "Yukiai," where she seeks out new encounters and collaborations with



artists and taiko groups within Japan and throughout the world. Kojima is known for her original dancing style during Kodo's taiko-based performances, which is best exemplified by her vivid portrayal of the goddess Ameno-uzume



in the first season of "Amaterasu" in 2006, directed by Tamasaburo Bando. She became a Kodo Distinguished Member in 2012, and was the director of the annual concert series "Kodo Special Performances on Sado Island" for four years, starting from its inaugural season that same year. She continues to ambitiously broaden her expressive outlets, as demonstrated by her recent productions based on the "Tales of Dojoji," which then became the inspiration for her first photo book, "Kasane no Kiyohime Monogatari: The Myriad Layers of Kiyohime," a unique work created with photographer Maiko Miyagawa and released in 2015.

For this performance, Kojima will share the stage in collaboration with Canada's premiere taiko group Nagata Shachu, for an unforgettable evening of dance, drums and song.

to contain the thunderous power of taiko remains a challenge. Hence the JCCC is embarking on a journey to create a sound-proof space that will house taiko, while ensuring all our existing programs and activities continue undisrupted. This exciting initiative is our Chris Kano Taiko Studio Project.

The Chris Kano Taiko Studio Project is JCCC's commitment to building a suitable soundproof space in the Centre which will allow us to run a taiko program that will nurture young players, as well as support the ongoing development of this art form, and its performers.

To do so, the JCCC is appealing for your partnership. We need to raise \$250,000 in order to turn an existing storage space into a sound proof studio. We are very grateful that a \$130,000 donation has already been pledged by an anonymous donor. With your help and generosity, we can make taiko more accessible to our community, especially our children and youth. And in the true spirit of the JCCC, we want taiko to be one more way we reach out and build "friendship through culture".

The JCCC chose to name this studio after the late Chris Kano, because of Chris' ability to engage community through his energy, and also of his contribution as a driving force for the Yakudo taiko group.

#### **Nikkei Veterans Celebration**

On Friday November 3, 2017, Heritage hosted a Nikkei Veterans Celebration to honour veterans from WWI, WWII, and the Korean War. In attendance were six S-20 WWII Nisei Veterans along with some of their spouses, four widowed spouses of WWII and Korean War Veterans, and family members representing WWI and WWII veterans. Also joining them were five active military personnel including Stuart Seki and four naval personnel from HMCS York.

It was heartening to see the comradery of these men and their families who had gathered together for this day of celebration. "Catching up" and the renewal of old acquaintances was evident, and for those of us who were the "onlookers" we had a chance to see some of the artefacts and pictures that were brought for the occasion as well as hear stories about them. For those who had not attended past celebrations this was truly a moving experience, and several expressed their appreciation and thankfulness for being able to attend.

And it truly was a celebration. It was a celebration of the 100 years of active service by Japanese Canadians beginning with WWI and continuing to today. It was a celebration of the WWI Veterans who fought for their country to show that they too were committed and loyal Canadians and strongly believed in the importance of fighting for their right to be able to vote after the war was over. It was a celebration of the WWII Veterans who even though they had their rights and freedom taken from them after Japan bombed Pearl Harbour and faced many barriers against their enlisting still found a way to enlist and serve. It was a celebration of the Japanese Canadian Veterans whose actions are a very important part of our Nikkei history and reflect another facet of who we are as Canadians.

The formal program included greetings from Jan Nobuto, Heritage Chair and Gary Kawaguchi, President of the JCCC, and messages sent from MP Ratansi and MPP Coteau. After the playing of the Last Post and then the Rouse by Dan Kapp, WWII Veteran Min Yatabe read the Act of Remembrance, followed by Ewan Craig, grandson of WWII Veteran Eiji Yatabe who read In Flanders Field. Dee Dee Yatabe then invited each veteran, spouse, widow, and family member representing WWI, WWII, and Korean War Veterans to place a poppy on the ceremonial wreath and light a candle of remembrance. As they did this Gary presented them with a unique pin designed to celebrate the 100 years of military service by Nikkei Veterans.

Also on the program was Susan Yatabe, daughter of Eiji Yatabe WWII Veteran. Susan, who wrote a two part article for Nikkei Voice about the Japanese Canadian participation in WWI and WWII, did a brief presentation on this topic. She outlined the situation faced by Issei and Nisei veterans, underscoring the difficulties they had in enlisting and how WWI veterans lobbied the government to gain voting rights after the war was over.

To conclude the formal part of the program Frank Moritsugu shared some light-hearted anecdotes about his experience overseas interspersing some of his thoughts with harmonica music that took us back to that time in history. The feeling of nostalgia was set and such an appropriate way to end this

day of celebration, which wasn't quite over. We still had an opportunity to hear a few more stories – both about the war and lives lived after the war, while we enjoyed a wonderful bento lunch together. Only when the last bite of the Nikkei Veterans Celebration cake was devoured did we bid farewell until the next celebration and the opportunity to honour both our Nikkei Veterans and current military personnel, something we plan to continue doing.

Hajime Sawada is one of the Archives' Wednesday group of volunteers. He began volunteering with us in January of 2014 and since then has become an integral part of our group!

#### Peter Wakayama Awarded Top Honour by SHODO Canada

In a world of bombastic world leaders, natural disasters and the ubiquitous twitter-verse, it is a pleasure to glide into a safe and serene environment of peace and harmony. Welcome to the 10th Japanese Calligraphy Competition at the JCCC Gallery organized by SHODO Canada that took place on November 5th.

"SHODO explores elements of art, shape and space," says a SHODO Canada member. "The beauty in the calligraphy is control of the flow of the brush and ink across the paper."



For any particular piece, the calligrapher has only one chance to create with the brush. The brush strokes cannot be corrected because a lack of confidence can be detected in the work. The calligrapher must concentrate and be fluid in execution. To achieve this, artists focus on simplicity, beauty and a mind-body connection. It requires an inner stillness, spiritual concentration and practice, practice, practice.

One person who has achieved a high level of SHODO mastery is Peter Wakayama who was awarded the 2017 Dr. Rick Nishikawa Memorial Award for his piece titled, Not Knowing. More complex looking than other pieces on the walls, Wakayama's art has flowing but busy brush strokes that remind me of abstract architectural drawing script.

Every year, the SHODO exhibition, with its endless number of contemplative scrolls, transforms the JCCC gallery into a haven of spirituality and a meditative state.



# Japanese Calligraphy Competition in Canada 2017 Exhibition Opening

Shodo Canada held their Tenth Annual Japanese Calligraphy Competition in Canada Opening and Award Presentations on Sunday November 5th to a full attendance in the JCCC Gallery to honour and celebrate the work of 165 entries of 127 adults and 38 students from across Canada. This was a special occasion as we celebrated the tenth anniversary of this competition. The afternoon was graced by the greetings by the following representatives from our supporting organizations: Consul General Takako Ito of the Consulate General of Japan, the Executive Director Yuko Shimizu of the Japan Foundation, Toronto, President Gary Kawaguchi and Executive Director James Heron of the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre and President Noriko Maeda of Shodo Canada.



#### 花嫁移住プラジル生活五十年

10月12日JCCCで開催された戦後カナダ移住50周年記念式典のゲストスピーカーとして、「花嫁移住ブラジル生活五十年」を語られた長崎県佐世保市出身の松本富子さんは、日本航空羽田空港事務所で英文タイピストをされてた方です。6年前に移住されてた幼馴染の住むブラジル東北海岸最大の都市レシーフェに1966年に嫁入りされました。1967年当時たまたまレシーフェに滞在してた僕は、裏通りの片隅で店に日本航空のカレンダーの掛けられた二坪ほどの小さなパステラリア「東京ランシ」で働いてた富子さんと二言三言、言葉を交わしたと記憶します。それはそれは美貌の若奥様でした、なんのなんの50年後の今も益々チャーミングになられ、お綺麗です。英語のランチは昼食ですが、ランシと発音するブラジルでは軽食を意味します。旧宗主国ポルトガルではパステルは甘いケーキですが、ブラジルでは揚げ餃子です。ブラジル東北地方は17世紀にオランダが統治しており、オランダ系ブラジル人の僕の妻マリアの実家は奥地の農家で、高校と大学がレシーフェでした。

十年後に妻の里帰りに付き合い、この熱帯の港町を訪れたら東京ランシは都心の一等地に移転し、マクドドナルドの様な円形のモダンな店に様変わりしてました。そのまた十年後には高級住宅街にタベルナ(居酒屋)を開店され、フトゥーラ街の角にあるので通称「未来の街角」が店名になってます。その後も、富子さんの経営手腕が功を奏し、同じ通りにパチオレストラン「相撲」と「東京カフェ」も開店され、海岸沿いの「寿司よし」も含め4軒の日本料理レストラン

のオーナー。この熱狂的な 相撲ファンである女性店主 の生き様に感嘆した次第で す。

リタイヤーして以来、僕は熱帯生まれで熱帯育ちのマリアの里帰りに付き合い、寒いカナダの冬の3ヶ月間はレシーフェで暮らしてます。その都度、トロントの無料雑誌トルジャ、ビッツ、



弁当ボックスを持って行って富子さんに差し上げてたので、今年は語学学校で英語の勉強に半年間トロントで暮らされました。月極めアパートメントホテル入居前の3週間は我が家に居候されたので、着かれた週に早速「トロント元気かい」に案内したらケーキにウエルカム トミコと英語でデザインされており感激。念願の野球メジャー観戦も3度、「トロント歌声喫茶の会」ではオタワから参加されてる同年の女性メンバーがオタワ観光に連れて行かれたり、「歌おうネットカラオケ」の女性陣から誘われ、仏教会館での夏のカラオケパーティーに出演、JCCC夏のカラオケパーティーでも歌われ、とても曽孫が居るとは思えない若々しい美声を披露されました。「JSS歌の会」の仲間とは各国の夏祭りやサウザンドアイランドまで遠足を楽しまれ、カナダ生活を満喫されホームシックに罹る暇もなかったとか。

高校時代には卓球選手としてインターハイや国体に出場された 富子さんはマーカムのユニオンビルでの卓球女子ワールドカップ を観戦された後、去年バルセロナでの卓球マスターズ世界選手権 大会に出場されたトロントの馬場選手とラーメンを食べに行かれ 親交を深められました。「歌おうネットカラオケ」の常連になられた 富子さんと、このカラオケを主宰されてる岡栄三さんとは、お互い高2の時にインターハイ(全国高校卓球選手権大会)徳島大会に出場されてたことがわかり奇遇を懐かしんでおられました。勿論、出場された当時は17歳ですから旧姓「米森富子」昔の名前で出ておられたと記録に残ってます。米森選手は長崎県代表の佐世保商業高校、山梨県代表の岡選手は甲府工業高校。

五十周年でのスピーチを終えステージを降りた富子さんの許に駆け寄りハグされたのは佐世保出身で同郷の柳田孝子さん、言わずと知れたトロントの誇る世界的オペラ歌手。僕は来年カーニバル直後の2月にレシーフェから空路3時間のサンパウロまで行き、毎月第3土曜に日本人町の宮崎県人会館で開催されてる「叙情歌の集い」で富子さんと一緒に参加の予定です。3月には毎月第1土曜にサンパウロの日本人町にあるブラジル日系老人クラブ連合会で開催されてる「なつメロ合唱の集い」にも出席します。富子さんのレコーディングされたCDはブラジル全土で好評発売中で、老人クラブ連合会会長の五十嵐司さんは日系歌姫として人気者の富子さんの歌唱力を「なつメロの女王」と絶賛されてます。末筆になりましたが、カナダの同胞の活動に感動された富子さんはカナダドル残金全額をJCCCに寄付され、楽しかったカナダでの想い出を胸に半年ぶりのブラジルへ元気に帰って行かれました。

年齢と共に身体のあらゆる部分が衰え、次第にあちこちと痛みが出るようになります。でも少しの自覚と努力があれば、それらを避けることは可能です。あなたの身体の軸はどのような状態でしょう?案外と知らない人が多く、いつの間にか身体が歪み、見た目の姿勢の悪さを招いています。

さあ、姿勢をチェックしてみましょう! 壁に左右のかかとをつけて立ちます。壁に かかと、お尻、肩甲骨と後頭部が無理なく

つきますか?その姿勢では深呼吸しにくい、膝がしっかり伸ばせない、腰が反り過ぎる(壁と腰との間にこぶしが入るほどの空間ができる)、姿勢を保つのがとても苦痛などの現象がある人は要注意です。家族や友人に確認してもらいましょう。

歪みは長い期間をかけて作られていくので、子どもの頃から意識することが大事です。横座りする、足を組んで座る、椅子に寄りかかって浅く座る、うつぶせで本を読む、腕枕でTVを観る、高い枕で眠る、いつも同じ側で物を持つ、効き手で長時間作業する、ハイヒールで長距離を歩く等々。これらは悪い姿勢を生じさせます。

歩き方にも関心をもちましょう!あなたの歩く姿勢を見たことはありますか?動画を撮る機会はあっても、歩く前姿・後姿が映し出されることは意外とないものです。私の場合、後ろ姿を映し出す動画を観て何かおかしいと感じたことや、左の膝や股関節に違和感があったことがきっかけで、10年前に整体術師と整形外科医に面談したのです。「普通の人なら、このくらいの歪みには気づきません」と言われました。若い頃から常に良い姿勢に関心を注いできたことやナースとしてのプロ意識が働いたお蔭でしょう。

生きていけばいくほど身体には様々な変化が生じます。それは仕方のないことです。でも早めに気づいて何らかのアクションを起こせば、痛みや行動制限が大きくなるのを防げます。それは、生活の質の維持あるいは向上につながります。私は、6か月ごとに整体術師による骨筋肉系の健康診査を受けています。そのたびに何らかの指摘があるので、6か月後の施術までに修正する様に気をつけます。これを10年間繰り返すことにより変形性膝・股関節症に陥らずに済み、整形外科医を受診する必要は生じていません。

家でTVを観るとき、電車で座る時、立った姿勢を保つ時など、自然と良い姿勢を心がけるようになりました。もう何気なくやっているのですから、本当にすごい(笑)!私の場合は軸足が左のため、どうしても左に身体の重みがかかり、左の膝や股関節に負荷がかかります。ですから、立ったままの姿勢を保つ際は(クッキング、信号待ち、教会ミサなど)、左足をやや浮かして右足に重心をかけ、胸を張って両膝を伸ばした姿勢をとるようにしています。その姿勢をとると、腰、腹筋、下肢に緊張を感じます。それって、普段はどうしても自分にとって楽な姿勢をとっている証拠…。「良い姿勢を保持することは本当に難しい」と実感する瞬間です!

この実感こそが、自身の歪みをしっかりと意識することにつながります。
