As it has been for everyone around the world, 2020 proved to be a year of unprecedented challenges and the JCCC found itself facing probably the greatest challenge we have had to weather in our nearly 60 year history.

For the safety of our members

and community we closed the Centre on March 15 just prior to the announcement of the broader lockdown. We have remained closed since that date but we have been busier than ever. In order to continue to deliver on our mandate we have pivoted to online and have created virtual concerts, Japanese lessons, sake seminars, Issei Day, art exhibitions, children's activities, dance and music programs, the Fuyu Matsuri winter festival, a cross-country virtual edition of the Toronto Japanese Film Festival, an online fundraiser, an improved website, as well as a broad spectrum of heritage offerings including Remembrance Day for the Nisei veterans.


Our new exhibition, Maru: Immigration Stories will explore Nikkei stories across the Americas and is currently being installed in the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre and virtually on Google Art and Culture. The summer months also saw our martial arts clubs conducting outdoor practices in our parking lot and the JCCC Garden.

We have also prepared the physical building for reopening with new safety protocols, touchless faucets, automatic main doors and enhanced HVAC systems for greater air flow. In short, we are ready to go and cannot wait to reopen our doors to you.

Since those first anxious days last March we have received countless messages of goodwill and encouragement. Thank you. As exhausting and confusing as this past year has been, it has brought out the best in so many and happily confirms just how much the Centre means to so many people.

The JCCC remains blessed with a multitude of selfless volunteers, an active membership and community, a committed board of directors and a dedicated staff. I want to offer my sincere thanks to the community for giving me the chance to be a part of the Centre again for this, my 20th year. It is an honour and I do my best to serve the community in the manner it deserves. I wish you a Merry Christmas, a Happy Holiday and a 2021 that finds us again gathering at the JCCC in the happy pursuit of "Friendship through Culture."

We are living in unprecedented times and at the JCCC Foundation we are proud to be a source of support and funding for JCCC operations, which have been significantly impacted by the pandemic during 2020.

We continue to oversee the investment of donations raised by the JCCC, and are engaged in ensuring that we are stewarding the capital so that operating funds are always available to the JCCC. Despite the volatile markets, the investments have maintained their value, and we continue funding JCCC operations.

In addition to the funding, the Foundation has provided the JCCC with a credit facility of \$1 million to be drawn for operational and other costs, as required. Both the distributions and potential draws on the line of credit will be funded out of the investment income, and if required, liquidating some of the investments.

Since 2013, The Japan Earthquake Relief Fund, which is administered by the JCCC Foundation, has supported 52 qualified undergraduate and graduate students from the Tohoku region, studying medicine, nursing, psychology and psychiatry. We funded several university terms of their education, with many more to come. Funding of approx. \$672,000 has been disbursed to these students, as well as \$100,000 to Red Cross, \$100,000 to each of the 3 prefectures, Iwate, Fukushima and Miyagi, and a \$15,000 contribution to the Canadian Embassy. Feedback has been very positive. Many students have sent letters of appreciation, and we are arranging a recognition event for our donors in partnership with the Canadian Embassy in Tokyo, so that the students can thank our Canadian donors.

Given the uncertainty of the current pandemic, to ensure we have sufficient funding to continue to support the JCCC operations, we would appreciate your considering a donation to the JCCC Emergency Relief Appeal to ensure that the JCCC will be able to continue to provide their great community support.

I would like to acknowledge and thank my Board Members for all the work this year in setting the course for our Foundation and providing wise counsel throughout the year. I am very thankful that we have a very engaged Board.

On behalf of the Board of Directors of the JCCC Foundation I wish you and your families a safe and happy holiday season and a healthy and prosperous New Year!



As we are getting closer to the launch of the new exhibit Maru: Immigration Stories, we would like to share one of the many elements that inspired our exhibit team. During the early stages of research for the exhibit, while searching through the Nikkei Museum Database, we came across Tadashi Ode's Passport Document. While the portrait photograph of Tadashi Ode, a young teenager at the time the photograph was taken, was certainly prominent on the immigration document, one of the stamps on the card caught our attention. The stamp situated on the bottom right of the document reads, "M.S. Hikawa Maru".

The Hikawa Maru was introduced to the NYK Line in 1930 and service the route between Japan and Seattle with stops in Victoria BC. By this period, the Japanese Canadian community was more established than before and families who had the means were travelling to Japan as most still had family in Japan. For that reason, dozens of photographs in the JCCC's collection showcase Japanese Canadians travelling on ships like the Hikawa Maru. The Hikawa Maru had two sister ships, Hiye Maru and Heian Maru, both ships are also found in photographs in the JCCC's Archives.

During World War II, the Hikawa Maru was repurposed as a hospital ship. In 1960, the ship made its final journey from Vancouver to Yokohama where it retired. Since 1960, the ship went through major restoration and today, visitors can visit the Hikawa Maru in Yokohama, Japan as it evolved into a museum. In 2016, the Hikawa Maru was assigned as Important Cultural Property by the government of Japan. Once the JCCC reopens, you will have a chance to visit exhibit Maru: Immigrations and see a replica of the Hikawa Maru in the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre.



Why do you study Japanese? How long have you been studying Japanese?

Chicken Curry –

This is a great dish for those cooler days of late autumn and early winter. You can use whatever meat or vegetables you have around. It can also be served over noodles or over rice. A larger batch freezes well so that you can have a quick meal on another day.



Ingredients (Serves 2)

2 medium potatoes, peeled and cubed

- 1 medium carrot, peeled and sliced
- 1/2 onion, sliced
- 1 celery stalk, sliced
- 1 tbsp oil


225 grams cubed chicken (breast or thigh)

- 1/4 package (110g)
- Japanese curry mix
- 4 cups water

Cooked udon noodles

Equipment

Medium saucepan
Medium pot
Cutting board
Sharp vegetable knife
Small mixing bowls
Measuring cups and spoons
Wooden spoons



Instructions

- 1. Wash and peel potatoes and carrots.
- 2. Cube potatoes into half inch pieces (To cube your potato, first slice into half inch slices, then slice the slices into half inch slices, then turn and cut again for cubes) and set aside.
- 3. Slice peeled carrots into 1/4 inch coins and set aside.
- 4. Peel onion, then cut in half and slice each half thinly. Set aside.
- 5. Trim ends off of celery, then cut in half lengthwise and slice thinly. Set aside.
- 6. Trim any fat off of chicken and make sure it is in bite sized pieces.
- 7. Heat oil in saucepan over medium-high heat. When oil is hot, add chicken cubes and brown on all sides.
- 8. Add 2 cups of water to browned chicken and stir.

- 9. Add the vegetables and enough water to cover them to the saucepan and bring the liquid to a boil. Stir in the curry cubes and simmer for 20 minutes until cooked through.
- 10. Serve curry over noodles and enjoy! Alternatively, many grocery stores sell pre-cut squash which you can use in this recipe.

You can substitute beef or turkey for the chicken!! Or have it over rice instead of noodles!!

Storage and Reheating


- Store any leftover curry in the refrigerator. Leftovers should be eaten or discarded within 3 days. Reheat in a saucepan or in the microwave.
- Alternately, leftovers may be frozen for up to 2 months. Allow to defrost over night in the refrigerator, then reheat as above.

This fall, I enjoyed having the opportunity to work with Su Yen on the Sedai Project as a Digital Archives Assistant and meeting the JCCC Staff. Before having this position, I was mainly familiar with Japanese culture through manga since there was not a lot of focus in high school on how people of color were experiencing World War II. By having the time at the beginning to read and watch the films from the Reading Guide, it helped to fill this void for me. Through transcribing the oral interviews, the interviewees' experiences took me on a journey of resilience and provided details to a previously unknown history. With more details, I could better imagine the different impacts decisions made during the war had on people in Canada. This experience added to my university theoretical knowledge from my coursework in information studies because it represented how having community involvement and oral artefacts can add to an audience's experience of an archives' collection.



Broken Promises

Grounded in research from Landscapes of Injustice – a 7-year multi-disciplinary, multi-institutional, community engaged project, this exhibit explores the dispossession of Japanese Canadians in the 1940s. It illuminates the loss of home and the struggle for justice of one racially marginalized community. The story unfolds by following seven narrators. Learn about life for Japanese Canadians in Canada before war, the administration of their lives during and after war ends, and how legacies of dispossession continue to this day.

Artist Nobuo Kubota at the JCCC Gallery

It's not every day that the JCCC Gallery can boast a National Treasure, but the presence of Nobuo Kubota, raises the level of experimental, contemporary art to a new high level. Kubota received the Governor General's Award for the arts in 2009. His work is held in numerous collections including the National Gallery of Canada and the Art Gallery of Ontario.

Nobuo Kubota's work combines sound, music, installation and film - a practice that he labels 'Intermedia'. His pieces are an exploration of phonic sounds that are translated into unique artistic expression. His sound experiments, exploring phonetic lyrics, connecting with visual arts and sculptures can be confusing and mind boggling. But, it is art at an international level. It makes me want to find out more.

A former saxophone player, Kubota began to explore sound with other artists as a stimulus for creativity. "We branched into other instruments and soon we were using gongs, and bells and other noisemakers," he says. "It's a way of opening up my mind to new ideas. There are no rules."

So it is no surprise that Kubota is intrigued with Japanese Noh opera. "I like the sounds and the music – the way the actors slowly drift across the stage."

Masterfully curated by Katherine Yamashita, a member of the JCCC Art Committee with a PhD in Fine Arts, the exhibit "The Intermedia Work of Nobuo Kubota (A JCCC Gallery Virtual Exhibition) is wonderfully out there.

"It was such a privilege to bridge the East and the West, the visual and the auditory in these works," says Yamashita. "Nobuo's Intermedia works are an artist's translation of multiple cultural phonic and sonic influences employed in a striking, original way."

For me, Kubota's phonic sounds remind me of the experimental scat singing that Louis Armstrong made famous in the early jazz days of the 1920's. While seen as unconventional and offensive at the time, soon everybody was scat singing including Bing Crosby, Danny Kaye and Tony Bennett.

All disciplines in the arts – drama, dance, visual arts – are exploring sound and Kubota is right there. During the recent City of Toronto Nuit Blanche exhibition, visitors remarked how this was their favorite exhibit.

This is an astounding exhibition. Kubota's work is avantgarde at an international level. It should go farther than the JCCC Gallery.

The First Shin Hanga and The Great Kanto Earthquake of 1923

Shin hanga means "new" woodblock prints, but the movement is more than one hundred years old. Given how things evolve, the first example of any vintage style is not always knowable and would at least be arguable. Many consider the design in our photo to be the first shin hanga woodblock print. If so, the movement started in an unassuming way with a modest boat moored in a quiet, snowy corner of the Sumida River in Tokyo. The year is 1907, and the artist of The Sumida Bank in the Night is Takahashi Shotei, aka Hiroaki. This rare scene is usually found with an inky black sky, but depicted here is a lighter example that has passed through our collection. What is not in dispute is that the originator of shin hanga was Watanabe Shozaburo, the publisher of this view of the Sumida dike.

Shotei was the first of several artists with whom Watanabe sought a departure from nineteenth century *ukiyo-e*. He went on to collaborate with painters like Ito Shinsui, Hashiguchi Goyo, Natori Shunsen, Charles Bartlett, and most notably Kawase

Hasui. Rather than attempts to realize a pre-conceived vision of *shin hanga*, the early years were marked by experimentation in landscape, *bijin-ga* (pictures of beautiful women), and *kabuki-ga* (kabuki actor portraits). The publisher's primary landscape artist, Hasui, was bound for fame. Hasui embraced the experimentation, leaving us varied and ground-breaking 1910s and early 1920s work.

The Great Kanto Earthquake of 1923 and its accompanying firestorms and tsunami brought a devastating human and physical toll to a vast region. Such large-scale tragedies have many less significant ripples. One in particular was of some consequence for *shin hanga*. Watanabe Shozaburo's Tokyo print shop was destroyed by fire in the quake.

The publisher would later resume business, but the lasting effect of the fire was the loss of nearly all of the blocks used to produce the company's pre-quake woodblock prints. It is typical for blocks to be re-used to make later editions. With the blocks gone, an existing woodblock print

would have to be used as a guide to recarve new blocks. A painstaking process to be sure, it is rarely if ever undertaken by the original publisher of a *shin hanga* print. The final result would no doubt be of high quality but also destined to differ from the original in some aspect or other. Watanabe's blocks were never re-carved.

This is not to say to that there has not been valuable re-carving of older works such as classical *ukiyo-e*. Organizations like the Adachi Institute have been making faithful versions of *ukiyo-e* for many years – allowing ordinary people to own not merely a machine reproduction of a Hiroshige or Utamaro but a genuine woodblock version produced entirely by hand from start to finish.

Still, collectors of pre-earthquake Hasui prints, for example, value the craft and inspiration of the original carvers and printers, the look and feel of period pigments and papers, and the intangible charm of antiquity.

心身の衰え(老い)を感じるのはどんな時!?

「あれっ!何だか今までと違うなあ」と心身の変化を感じたことがありますか?一般的には30歳頃から何らかの変化を感じ始め、70歳頃になると「元気がなくなった~」と意識する機会が増えます。歩く速度が落ちた、歩くとすぐに疲れる(息切れする)、転びやすくなった、硬いものが食べにくくなった、食べる量が減った、友人と外出しなくなった、何だか楽しくない…これらの変化は老い(エイジング)の兆候かもしれません。すべてOKというあなた!免疫力・体力の維持を目指して努力されてきた証です。当てはまる内容の多い人ほど、やはり衰えが気になっているのではないでしょうか。

シニアである私も他人ごとではありません。特に体力維持は課題です。一時期、夫とジムに通っていましたが、夏も冬も空調による乾燥に襲われ、私にはとても過ごせる場所ではないことがわかりました。暑すぎず寒すぎず快適に管理している我が家に比べ、若者の多いジムではどうしても強く設定しています。

また、寒い気温に身体が様々に反応する様になり、専門医の勧めもあって冬は籠のトリ状態で暮らしているので、自宅での自主運動は必須です(ホントに!)。ということで、日常生活で無理なくやれる歯磨き時のかかと落とし、湯が湧く時間を待つ間のスロースクワット(10回3セット)、テレビ体操(見逃す事も!)、歌レッスン中でもやれるクネクネ体操、様々な曲調に合わせて盆踊り、日本舞踊、フラやモダンダンスを楽しむ、名付けて"めちゃくちゃ踊り"、夕食準備前のストレッチ&筋トレ、つま先立ち歩行を行っています。

つま先立ち歩行は、数年前にNHKニュース番組が「つま先立ちで毎日ダンスを続けたら腰痛やひざ痛がなくなった70代男性」を紹介したことがきっかけです。冬の制限された暮らしと広い我が家の状況にとても合っているとガッテン! それ以来、もう無意識に10本の足指

で歩き、ふくらはぎの筋力が付いてきましたよ。暮らしの中に習慣化することが何よりも継続性と利便性に適っていますね!

さて、100歳以上のシニア(百寿者)を長期にわたって追跡した広瀬信義氏らの研究は「余命は糖尿病と関係するへモグロビンA1cや動脈硬化の危険因子とされるLDL(悪玉)コレステロール値や持病があることとは統計的に連動していず、むしろフレイル(Frail 虚弱)であるシニアが早く亡くなっていたこと」を明らかにしています。「糖尿病や高血圧などの持病があれば定期的に受診し、その他の健康状態にも気を使うようになり、健康意識を高める行動につながるのではないか」と、私も推察しています。ただし、持病とうまく付き合うための努力をせずに放っておけば、やはり命を脅かします。

フレイルには身体的、心理的、社会的側面の3つがあります。日本の双子姉妹のきんさん(享年107歳)、ぎんさん(享年108歳)をご存知ですか?ぎんさんには「人は脚から死ぬ」という信念があり、散歩を欠かさなかったとか。脳底部の太い血管や細い動脈にほとんど動脈硬化がなかったのは(死亡解剖)、とても稀なことです。血管年齢がいかに若いかを示しています。虚弱にならないように魚の多い食事、腹八分目や動くことに関心をもって暮らしていたようです。テレビ出演など社会活動を行っていたことも、生きがいと活力のある日々につながったのではないでしょうか。

皆さまは、血管を強くしなやかに保つためにどのような点に留意していますか?極めてシンプルなことですが、高血圧を招く塩分と動脈硬化を促進する糖分・脂質を摂り過ぎないことです。これらは生活習慣病を防ぐ基本です。さらには有酸素運動(散歩など)、禁煙、ストレス対策も大事になりますが、何と言ってもまず食生活です!ただし、シニアでは青年

期・中年期と異なり、栄養不足によりフレイルが生じやすくなります。上記に注意しながらも、しっかりといろんな栄養素を摂るように心がけましょう。

心理的側面に関しては「85歳以上の高齢者の幸福感は高い」との研究結果に、私は関心を寄せています。一般的に不幸と思える出来事は誰にでも容赦なく押し寄せます。特別な時代背景や環境を除けば、人の人生においてそれらの経験にあまり差異はないと思われます。しかし、どう感じるかは個人によって大きく異なります。幸福感が高いということは、今ある状況を肯定的に受けとめているということです。前向きな考え方は免疫力を高めるうえで大事と考えられるので、長寿との関連について興味深く感じています。

「フレイルの3つの側面の中でも、特に社会的側面はあらゆる健康分野に影響を与えており、カギとなっている」と、飯島勝矢氏は指摘します。私も先輩諸氏の生き方から様々な事を学び、まったく同意見です。「なぜ生きているのか(生きようとしているのか)」という想いを支えるのは、大なり小なりの願い(夢や目標)ではないでしょうか。例え老いても、それらの願いは家庭、仕事、ボランティア活動あるいは趣味などの世界を広げ、人々との絆を結び、生きる活力を生み出してくれると思います。私自身に関して言えば、プロ歌手・EIKO、古典日本舞踊家・花柳さわ英華として舞台に立ち続けたいという願いが、日常の体調管理を大きく支えています。


