So in addition to the JCCC's obligation as an employer to maintain a safe workplace, we are committed to ensuring that the JCCC is also safe for everyone who attends the premises, or attends events under the auspices of the JCCC regardless of location. The JCCC takes all reasonable steps to ensure risks to health and safety are identified, assessed and managed appropriately.

This commitment to health and safety guides our actions and procedures as we begin to gradually reopen the JCCC for our members, community and friends! Starting this month, we are excited to be opening our doors and giving tours of the new MARU: IMMIGRATION STORIES permanent exhibition in the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre and the BROKEN PROMISES installation in the JCCC Gallery. Initially dates and hours will be limited and you will need to pre-book your visit. We are also open for event rentals and following current Provincial guidelines.

You can expect more events and classes to open over the course of the autumn. At the same time, we'll continue to provide cultural and community offerings online and through outreach. Issei Day, for example, will follow last year's model with bento being delivered.

The JCCC recognizes that all visits to the Centre are a choice and that everyone who comes to the JCCC expects that we will provide as safe an environment as possible. To that end, we struck the Reopening Task Force to develop a reopening approach that takes every precaution to ensure you are safe when you come to the JCCC. We'll be asking you to help us by participating with us in taking precautions and observing the safety protocols. Greater detail on the new JCCC Health Protection Policy can be found on page 6 of this newsletter and is consistent with the JCCC's long standing commitment to being a safe and welcoming environment for all.

Message from the JCCC Board of Directors

Dear Members and Friends of the JCCC.

In September 2021 the JCCC began to reopen in a staged manner, initially for pre-booked tours of the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre and the JCCC Gallery. Please consult the JCCC website or newsletter for details on the reopening plan.

The JCCC approved a mandatory vaccination policy to come into effect in September and we are now adjusting our timing in compliance with the new rules announced by the Province of Ontario. Ontario has regulated that starting September 22nd everyone using indoor facilities such as restaurants, bars, gyms, meeting and event space, indoor sporting events and other facilities is to be fully vaccinated.

The JCCC is committed to the safety and well-being of our staff, volunteers, members, tenants, facility users, visitors and community. Our mission, Friendship through Culture depends primarily on programs, events and exhibitions that require gatherings of people at the JCCC. The mission is supported by ancillary streams of revenue generation, primarily event space rental and long-term leases with tenants; which also require gathering of people at the JCCC. So, in addition to the JCCC's obligation as an employer to maintain a safe workplace, we are committed to ensuring that the JCCC is also safe for everyone who uses the building, or attends events under the auspices of the JCCC regardless of location.

The COVID-19 pandemic has created a new and evolving challenge. The JCCC follows current public health guidelines and operational best practices, but we also intend to err on the side of caution for the health and well-being of all visitors.

The JCCC has created a Health Protection Policy that was passed unanimously by the board to guide its' safe re-opening and implemented the policy effective Wednesday, September 22, 2021.

ALL VISITORS 12 YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER WILL BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE PROOF OF FULL VACCINATION TO PARTICIPATE IN ANY ACTIVITIES DELIVERED UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE JCCC INSIDE THE JCCC FACILITY.

UNTIL THE PROVINCE'S VACCINE PASSPORT or QR CODE IS RELEASED THE ONLY ACCEPTABLE FORM OF PROOF IS:

PRINTED or ELECTRONIC COPY OF PROVINCIAL VACCINATION RECEIPT SHOWING TWO VALID DOSES WITH 2ND DOSE ADMINISTERED A MINIMUM OF 14 DAYS PRIOR. YOU CAN ACCESS A COPY OF YOUR VACCINATION RECEIPT BY GOING TO THE PROVINCIAL WEBSITE IN THE LINK BELOW.

AND VALID GOVERNMENT ID

NOTE - valid provincial vaccination receipts are 'watermarked'.

Important: you must have your copy on your person each time you visit the JCCC upon entering the building. We are not collecting and keeping your personal information. Unfortunately, there are no exceptions to this policy.

This policy applies to:

JCCC Board of Directors and Advisors

All JCCC Staff

Volunteers participating in onsite activity
Instructors participating in onsite activity

Class participants participating in onsite activity

Guests to the building

NOTE: Children who are currently ineligible for a vaccine are only permitted to attend events or classes under the auspices of the JCCC if they attend with a vaccinated adult family member escorting them at all times. Once they are eligible for a vaccine, this policy applies to them without distinction except for the requirement that a parent or guardian must sign a waiver and provide required documentation on the child's behalf.

Q&A

Q: Where can I access a copy of the Health Protection Policy?

A: The policy is posted on the JCCC website at jccc.on.ca

Q: How will access to the JCCC be monitored beginning September 22nd?

A: There will be one access point for check in by the reception desk. All members and guests will be asked to provide proof of vaccination upon check in. At this time and until the province has developed an electronic QR code, we will only accept a printed or electronic copy of your valid vaccination receipt. It is extremely important that you have this information on your person each time you check in or you will not be allowed access.

Q: What if I have a medical exemption or contraindication?

A: Unfortunately for members and guests, at this time the JCCC will not be in a position to consider the validity of these exemptions. Once valid medical exemptions are integrated as part of the provincial vaccine certificate, we will review this aspect of the policy.

Q: What if I don't have proof of my vaccination status?

A: A PDF of your vaccination certificate can be downloaded and printed by going to https://covid19.ontariohealth.ca/. This certificate is watermarked to ensure validity.

Q: What if I received a valid full vaccination outside of Ontario?

A: If you received a valid full dose vaccination outside of Ontario and you are an Ontario resident, you must provide valid proof from the country of origin. The Provincial Government is in process of developing tools to ensure verification of fully vaccinated individuals from outside Ontario and/or who were vaccinated outside of Ontario. The JCCC reserves the right to restrict access to any person if validity of vaccination proof is in question. Q: Are children under 12 years of age permitted in restricted areas?

A: Yes, under supervision of an adult who must be fully vaccinated.

Q: What about current COVID-19 protocols currently in place?

A: All current protocols will remain in place. They are:

You must be masked outdoors whenever 2m physical distancing cannot be maintained.

You must be masked indoors at all times. Masks can only be removed for eating or drinking.

Q: What should I do if I have additional questions?

A: All questions about JCCC guidelines, vaccination requirements or any other related topic should be directed to James Heron, who will respond on a confidential basis.

These remain very challenging times and the implementation of such a protocol will not be easy for Staff and Management. For the safety of all, we will rely heavily on the Membership for respect and full cooperation.

ONLINE CONVERSATIONAL LESSONS FOR INTERMEDIATE-ADVANCED STUDENTS:

Geared to intermediate or advanced students, 1 ON 1 Online Japanese Conversation is the JCCC online program (via Zoom) that focuses on conversation based learning. This will help develop your Japanese language skills by using a direct one on one basis.

All of our instructors are native Japanese speakers who are experienced/certified with Japanese language teaching techniques and are also fluent in English.

Lesson content and format are customizable on a student by student basis.

This program is for students 18 years of age or older. Hiragana reading skills are a requirement.

LESSONS AT YOUR CONVENIENCE:

Learn anytime to best suit your own convenience and preferred schedule. Lesson dates and times to be coordinated with your instructor in advance. Classes may be taken up to twice per week or once every 1-3 weeks according to students' desire. All lessons must be completed within a 3 month period (effective from the first lesson date).

LEARN JAPANESE WHILE SUPPORTING THE JCCC:

All funds from the 1 ON 1 Japanese Conversation program go directly to supporting the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre. As a result of the COVID 19 pandemic, activities at the JCCC have been severely curtailed. WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU VISIT THE JCCC

Effective September 22, 2021, all who enter the JCCC premises must:

- Provide proof of identification and proof of being fully vaccinated against COVID-19 before they can enter the area if they are 12 years old and older.
- · Wear a face mask inside the JCCC.
- Abide by all public health safety measures (including but not limited to capacity limits, patrons screening, masking, physical distancing and contact tracing).
- Complete the health screening questions as determined by the City of Toronto COVID-19 Active Screening tool.
- Comply with province's contact tracing procedure by providing your full name, contact information and reason for visit.

Please be ready to provide your proof of identification and your printed or electronic proof of vaccination. Examples of identification documents that may be used to confirm the identity of the holder of the vaccine receipt include:

- · Driver's licence
- · Permanent Resident card
- Passport
- · OHIP card

An individual is considered fully vaccinated if s/he has received:

- The full series of the COVID-19 vaccine as authorized by Health Canada.
- Their final dose of the COVID-19 vaccine at least 14 days prior to visit to the JCCC.

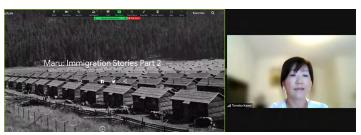

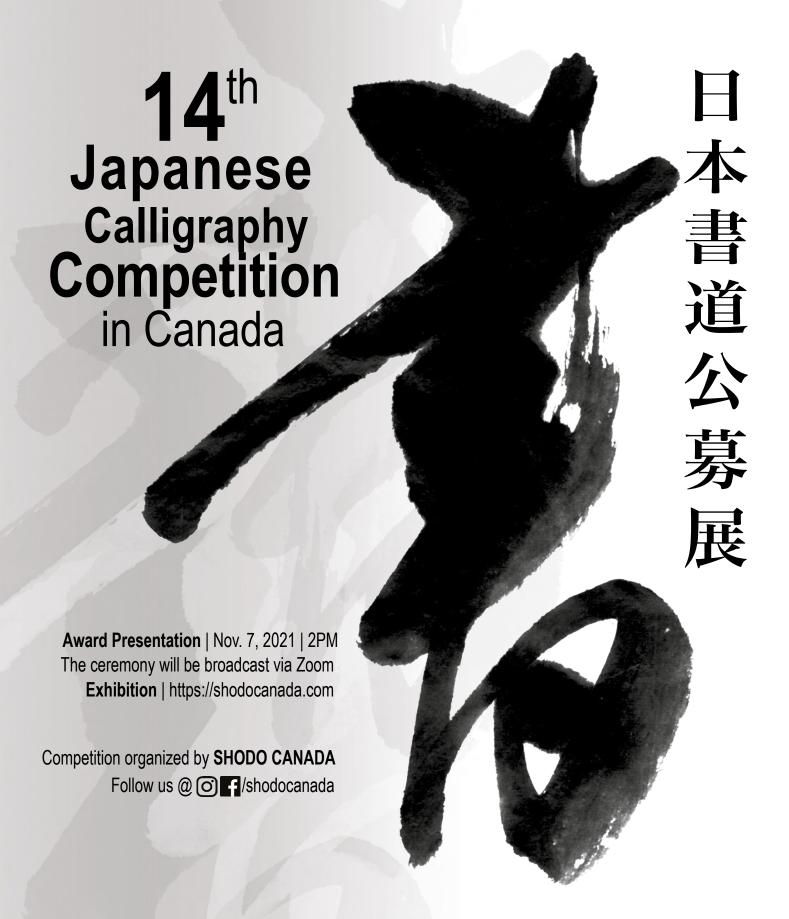


The Toronto Japanese Language School is seeking candidates for the position of Principal.

健やかな老後をめざしてその44 - 認知症サインに早く気づくために!

認知症とは、脳の神経細胞が病気によって傷つき死滅するために記憶障害などの症状が生じて日常生活に支障をきたす状態のことです。主な原因としては、脳にたんぱく質でできた老廃物が溜まって脳が委縮(アルツハイマー型やレビー小体型など)、脳出血や脳梗塞による血管性ダメージがあります。これらは誰にでも起こりうることであり、決して他人事ではありません。

最近の認知症研究はとても進んでいます。軽度の段階で気づけば、薬物治療によってその状態を長期に維持することが可能になっています。それどころか、生活習慣の見直しや様々なトレーニングによって改善さえ望める場合もあります。認知症になることを怖れるのではなく「自分にもやがて来る道」と考えて、積極的にその研究成果を役立てることです!発症予防とその準備として「英子の認知症対策」をお勧めします。対策5は既に済ませましたよ。あなた成りの「生活や志向に添った対策」を作成してみましょう~。

私はクッキングが大好きです。様々な能力がもっとも試されるように感じています。まず、どんな材料が必要かを考えて買い物し、冷蔵庫や冷凍庫を整理・活用しなければいけません。作る順番を考えて材料や調理器具の準備、美味しく仕上げるためにソース/香辛料の選択、火力の調整、美しく・楽しく盛り付けるための皿選び/テーブルセット、食後の片付け等など、多様な要素が組み込まれています。考えてみると非常に複雑な工程ですね。総合的技能(考える、実行する、細かな手先の技術を使う、五感を使う)を求められる作業です。

若い頃から"料理しながら片づける"を実践しています。食事が始まる時にはシンクは綺麗になっている、を心がけています。日本に居る頃は、一般的に食器洗浄器はなく、しかも片付けは全て女性の仕事でした。食後にゆっくりしたくて実践していたのが、いつの間にか習慣になりました。簡単なようでけっこう大変です(笑)。スムーズに行うための段取り(遂行機能)が要求されます。私の場合、その段取りがうまく行かなくなれば"あれっ?"と気づくのではないかと思います。もしそう感じ始めたら、認知機能の低下サインとして受け止め、その他の行動にも注目しましょう。もちろん、職業柄身についてしまった観察記録にしっかりと書き留め、受診の際に持参しま~す。

茶、コーヒー、酒や食べ物の香りを嗅ぐのも大好きです。特に、コーヒーを 淹れる時の香りを楽しむのが癒しになっています。10数年前から「自身の五 感(触覚、聴覚、視覚、味覚、嗅覚)がエイジングと共にどう変化するのか」に 関心を向けるようになりました。老年学専門家としての好奇心からでした。体 調、病気や薬物治療などにより五感は変化します。COVID-19はそのことを 強く私たちに印象づけましたね。

最近の研究は「認知症と嗅覚障害には深い関係があり、脳の病変が嗅細胞にも影響を及ぼす」ことを示唆しています。様々なタイプの認知症があるので全ての人に当てはまる訳ではないですが、もし記憶障害などに嗅覚障害が加わっていれば、早期発見の判断材料になりますね。一般的に、嗅覚低下は男性では60歳代、女性は70歳代から始まりますが、気づいていない人がほとんどです。徐々に進んでいくので気づきにくいのです。予防には嗅覚トレーニング(意識してにおいを嗅ぐ)が効果的と考えられています。私の場合、偶然にもトレーニングを実践していたことになります!更にどういったにおいか、左右差があるのかも意識しています。これが嗅細胞を再生させることにつながります。

70歳の今日この頃、以前と明らかに異なるのは、お湯を沸かしている折に他の用事を思いだしてキッチンを離れると、そのことを忘れてしまうようになった事です。40代後半の頃は、傍でPC作業している秘書にその文書変更を指示しながら、他部門からの電話も受け、デスクの会議資料にも目を通し、大学院生の研究計画についても詳細に検討していました。いくつかの仕事を同時進行させるのは日常茶飯事で、それに不都合が出る事はありませんでした。

それらを遂行する脳の力(ワーキングメモリ)は人によって違いはあるものの、エイジングと共に確実に落ちていきます。例えば、4つの仕事を同時に実行できていたはずなのに3つ、2つと少なくなっていきます。ですから、お湯を沸かしていることを忘れるようになってもそれ程心配はしていません。でも、その回数が増えたり、もの忘れが他の事柄でも目立つようになったり、前述したように料理の段取りが悪くなったりしたら、私は認知症専門医を受診します。あなたが日常生活で感じる問題の「頻度、程度と広がり」に注意することが大事です。

認知症の場合、家族や周囲は受診を勧めることをためらう場合があります。素直にアドバイスを受け入れられるように、40歳代になったら(もちろん若い人であっても)一人ひとりが認知症に対する正しい知識をしっかり養いましょう。正しい知識を得ることは、認知症であろうとどんな病気であるうと同様です。己の心身は己で守るという自覚ですね!「誰の世話にもならないから、別に受診する必要はないし、このままで良い」と考える人がいるかもしれませんが、人は人との関わりの中で暮らしています。人に迷惑をかけずに生きていきたい、死んでいきたいと願っても、残念ながらそれはできません…。当事者も心穏やかに、周囲もなるべく負担と感じずに、共に認知症と生きていける方法を考えることから逃げないようにしましょう~。

認知症を予防し、そのサインに早く気づくために、あなたはこの瞬間(今) からまず何を始めますか!?
