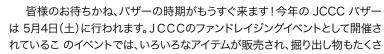

Cooking for Active Seniors

Each Cooking for Active Seniors class focuses on using one main ingredient to make three simple recipes. Participants make the recipes under the guidance of an instructor, enjoy tasting their finished products, and having time for socializing and sharing ideas.

The January class, "Which came first, the chicken or the egg?" had fifteen seniors who enjoyed making three simple recipes that focused on using egg and chicken – chawan mushi, vegetarian egg foo yung, and an easy chicken teriyaki. Once the dishes were made, participants enjoyed the fruits of their labour and each other's company.

Our next class date has been changed to Thursday March 28 at 11:00am and the focus is on pork. The recipes we will make are pork and nappa soup, mapo tofu, and steamed pork. If you are interested in joining us, sign up soon as the January class was oversubscribed.

Last year, our trees bloomed early (almost 2 weeks early!) with some trees being in full blossom by April 17. While we anticipate sakura blossoms for Bazaar this year, we just don't know how the weather is going to affect the blossoms.

With the JCCC now being home to over 100 trees, thanks in part to the generosity of Shiseido, we are planning for an extra busy O-Hanami. As weekends will be a very busy time, we are bringing in Parking Lot Attendants and signage reminding visitors to be safe and respectful in the parking lots.

- · Please park only in designated parking spots. Do not stop your vehicle in the laneway or stand in a place that may put you, or others in danger.

OPERATION TATAMI 2024

Operation Tatami 2024 is going well! Over the December holidays, the main floor was levelled, and the mat area increased to 128 mats, some of which are on loan from other dojos in the city. There is still time for you to contribute to this dojo renovation!

The JCCC has ordered Kusakura brand tatami, which is what is used in Japan, and at the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo, and all Tokyo and Osaka IJF Grand Slams in recent years. These are the finest tatami available. This is the official tatami of the All-Japan Judo Federation and exceeds all IJF certifications. The mat area has been enlarged to a full-size regulation competition area

comprised of a 32 yellow mat competition area with a 96 green mat safety area. This refresh will enable the JCCC tatami dojo to remain as the finest martial arts dojo in Canada. We expect the mats to arrive this spring!

Judo News - Joe Serianni

Sad news - long time leader in the Canadian judo community, Joe Serianni passed away in early February after a lengthy illness. Joe's long judo journey started in the 1960's at Frank Hatashita's dojo on Queen Street, and he would continue to become a 6th degree black belt.

Joe was an instructor at the JCCC from 2002 to 2008 and was instrumental in assisting the JCCC with organizing the legacy judo programs into the JCCC Judo Kai. But that was just a small part of his commitment to the development of judo, which was eloquently captured in the Judo Ontario message posted in his memory:

Mr. Serianni made a significant mark on judo in Ontario and Canada and will be remembered for his contribution across all aspects of the sport. He is a former President of Judo Ontario, Judo Canada Vice-President, and chairman of numerous committees. He was a referee at World Championships, the 1996 Olympic Games and the 2004 Paralympic Games and helped mentor and support the development of countless referees over the years. In recognition of his achievements and contributions, Mr. Serianni was inducted into the Judo Canada Hall of Fame as a Builder in 2014.

Joe helped Judo Canada organize our sport into the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP), and as a course instructor and evaluator he assisted with establishing technical and ethical standards for instructors. Joe was kind and generous in sharing his judo knowledge and experience that touched many in the judo community.

Apart from judo, Joe – who was a denturist by profession – was an avid enthusiast and/or participant in sports ranging from baseball, basketball, hockey, soccer to sumo – with diverse non-sports interests including cooking, travel, playing guitar, painting, gardening, and auto mechanics. Above all, his greatest passion and love was for his family – wife France and their children and grandchildren.

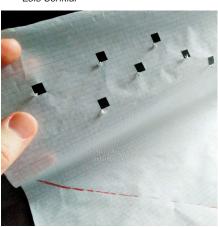

Seagrass Film Screening and Panel Discussion

On January 27, the JCCC Heritage Department hosted a screening of the 2023 film *Seagrass* by yonsei director, Meredith Hama-Brown, in partnership with the Greater Toronto Chapter of the National Association of Japanese Canadians.

Seagrass follows a sansei woman who, coping with the recent death of her mother, brings her family to a self-development retreat, in hopes of fixing her ailing marriage.

The film premiered at TIFF and has been on the festival circuit, but this screening was the first one to specifically bring together the Japanese Canadian community.

After the film, we held a panel discussion featuring Japanese Canadian artists and writers Kerri Sakamoto, Lara Okihiro, and Kristofer Sakamoto-Marshall, moderated by Lynn Deutscher Kobayashi.

The panelists discussed topics such as the narratives of Japanese Canadians in film and art and mixed-race identity. Audience members also had a chance to respond to the film at the end of the event.

Seagrass will be playing in select theatres starting February 23rd.

健やかな老後をめざしてその71 - 私を支え、育ててくれた言葉

あなたには大切にしている言葉がありますか?

何気なく口にだした言葉がある時には人を傷つけ、励まし、あるいは、思いもかけない様々な反響を引き起こすことを、私たちは知っています。現代社会では、1対1の直接的な会話や電話よりも、携帯メールやSNSによる交流が主流になりつつあります。いずれの方法であろうとも、生きることを支えてくれる言葉に出会えたならば本当に幸いです。私にも大切にしている言葉が幾つかあります。その中でも「専門職として生きる勇気を与えてくれた言葉」について語ってみたいと思います。

教育学部看護教員養成課程を卒業し、クリニカルナースとして働き始めた頃、施設で働くナースのほとんどは専門学校卒業者でした。案の定、就職した大学病院で働くナース350名のうち大卒は私のみ。先輩も後輩もいない、俗にいう"一匹オオカミ"的な存在でした。伝統的に技術習得を中心に学ぶ専門学校卒者に比べ、理論と技術の両者を学ぶ大卒者は、第一線の臨床の場においてすぐに役立つ動きができるはずもありません。また、卒後に継続して人材を育てる現任教育も充実していない時代でした。先輩の期待に応えることができない自身を歯がゆく思う日々が続きました。

そういったある日「豊澤さん、あなたは他のナースとどこか違うね!」と、ある医師に呼び止められました。研修医指導の厳しさに定評があり、私のような新人にとっては「なるべくなら近づきたくない」と煙たく感じる存在でした。個人的に声をかけられたのは初めてでした。「きっと何か指摘される!」と、怖れの気持ちが湧き上がりました。ところが、彼は「あなたの瞳は輝いているよ。それを大事にして毎日の症例から学びを深めなさい」と。

看護の上司や先輩からは「技術に時間がかかる」等と指摘されることはあっても、ほめられたことなど一度もありませんでした。私は本当にびっくりしました!「看護事象をしっかり捉えたい」と努力している姿勢をきちんと評価してくれる人がいたことに。

そのたった一度の言葉が、ナースとしてのその後を大きく支えてくれることになったのです。論理的思考をすでに確立していた医学と医学教育の中で育ってきた医師だからこそ"もがいている学びの芽"に気づいてくれたのだ、と思います。看護と看護教育が専門職として発展するために「看護学士課程を増やしていこう。そのために働こう!」と強く自覚しました。51年前、卒業したばかりの若造が将来の進むべき目標をはっきりと心に定めた、その原点ともなりました。

さて、私自身がこれまでに発した言葉は他者にどのように伝わったので しょう!?悲しみ、苦しみや憎しみを生む言葉よりも、癒し、喜びや勇気を もたらす言葉が多かったように、とただただ願うばかりです....。

ここ最近、持病(血液自己免疫疾患)により命の危機に陥りました。その際に励ましの言葉を送り続けてくださった方々に心から感謝するとともに、改めて言葉の大切さを学びました。過去を変えることはできませんが、今後は「心が癒される言葉、心が楽になる言葉、心が豊かになる言葉」をもっともっと意識しながら暮らしていきます。

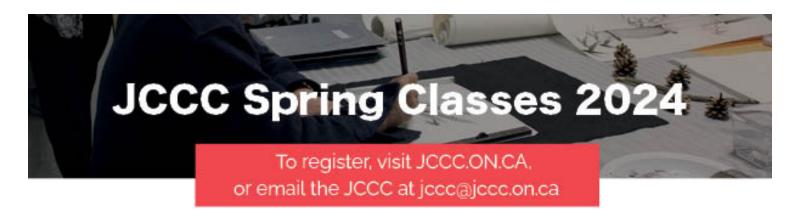
新年合宿, Look What These People Are Doing!!!

Since 2003, the JCCC Naginata Club has instructed members in the art of the Naginata, or Japanese polearm.
